NO Federal Funding for Homeless Detention Camps

Utah's Governor wants to take money away from housing to fund a [1,300-bed](#), government-run detention camp for homeless people. This plan includes forcing homeless people to the remote site and even holding them against their will. At no time in human history has forcing people into camps been a good thing, and this is no different. We need your help to make sure history does not repeat itself.

Utah's plan relies on money from the federal government. We're demanding that the federal government fund proven solutions to homelessness, such as housing and social services, not detention camps that punish people who cannot afford rent – not in Utah and not anywhere.

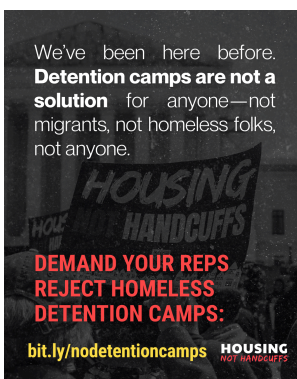
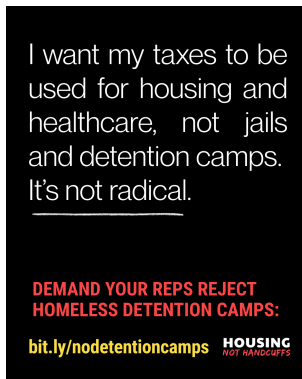
Here is how you can take action right now.:
